Nathaniel Coleman is Reader in History and Theory of Architecture at Newcastle University, UK. He previously taught in the US, worked as an architect in NY and Rome, and studied architecture at the Institute for Architecture and Urban Studies and RISD, and Urban Design at CCNY. His PhD was awarded by the University of Pennsylvania, where he worked with Jospeh Rykwert. He leads design studios and theory seminars, concentrating on the limits and possibilities of architectural neo-avant-gardes. His books include *Materials and Meaning in Architecture: Essays on the Bodily Experience of Buildings* (2020), *Lefebvre for Architects* (2014), and *Utopias and Architecture* (2005); and *Imagining and Making the World: Reconsidering Architecture and Utopia* (2011), as editor. He has published numerous book chapters and journal articles and presents his research internationally. After working on Utopia and Architecture since the 1990s, Coleman's focus has shifted toward reconstructing architecture through the invention of anarchist spatial practices.
